

Dr. Graizbord is the Shirley Curson Professor of Judaic Studies and Director of the Arizona Center for Judaic Studies. A historian of early modern and modern Jewish identities, Dr. Graizbord's research focuses mostly on the Western Sephardi Diaspora of the seventeenth century. Dr. Graizbord's writing addresses questions of religious, social, and political self-definition, Judeophobia, ethnicity, race, marginality, and dissidence. Graizbord published *The New Zionists: Young American Jews, Jewish National Identity, and Israel*, which probes the place of Zionism in the lives of American-Jewish "Millennials." Graizbord's third book, *Early Modern Jewish Civilization: Unity and Diversity in a Diasporic Society*, is forthcoming from Routledge.
