Our intern's day-to-day activities include all the parts of being a day-to-day psychologist in the schools. Interns are provided scaffolded supervision that slowly leads to more independence. We realize that reading "covering a campus on your own" may sound intimidating, but we are committed to providing ample supervision until interns are ready to take on a task on their own. Our goal is to foster independence and we strongly feel this model best supports that for internship in school psychology. School psychology does not have a "typical" day. One day, an intern will test and work with kids directly; another day, an intern will run a day of meetings; on another day, they may respond to a threat or crisis situation; and on yet another, they will go to a meeting with their administrator to help provide guidance on a particular issue of relevance to the field. Every day is different, but know that your supervisor is there to support you throughout the process.
