We offer a culturally diverse population with a broad spectrum of program experiences, including autism, emotional disabilities, preschool, and intervention practices. You will receive individual supervision and have the opportunity for group supervision with the district psychologist. Collaboration with various school staff is integral to our work, as we support and participate in interventions for both students and teachers.
