PESD recognizes the internship year as the capstone training experience in the school psychology profession leading to independent practice with skills consistent with the NASP Practice Model. The internship training, intern's role, and supervision provided are designed to support the school psychology candidate in achieving the goal of confident independence.

Interns will be placed side-by-side at a campus with their supervisor to support the intensity needed for the beginning of internship. Placement will be with one or more high performing and/or lead school psychologists. As the intern gains confidence and skills, the supervision will scale to meet the intern's progress. Interns will have the opportunity to work across all grades PK through 8. Interns will have a reduced caseload and onsite support. They will learn how to manage a caseload, collaborate with school teams, and develop their own processes and procedures for achieving the many tasks of school psychologists. School psychology interns will be an integral part of the MTSS processes at the school by consulting, screening, and intervening. School psychologists in the district typically engage in academic and behavioral consultation and interventions, mental and behavioral health services, crisis assessment and response, multidisciplinary evaluations, peer supervision in clinical cases, and professional development. Interns will partner with the supervisor and site social workers as the mental health team supporting the school for threat assessments and suicide risk assessments as well as MTSS processes related to behavioral and emotional needs.

Interns also have the opportunity to obtain supervised experiences with one or more of the following based on interests and skills: bilingual evaluation, district-level systems committee work, specialized programs (i.e. Montessori, traditional school, autism, early childhood, low incidence, medically fragile, social/emotional/behavioral support settings, private placements, alternatives to suspension).

Interns will be integrated into the school psychologist group for monthly Clinical Case Review sessions (group supervision) and structured professional development.
