The Roosevelt Internship Program is a highly structured and personalized experience designed to give interns the learning they need to become well prepared school psychologists. The intern typically spends their year assigned to their own K-8 school with a campus of about 350 students. The lead psychologist is their primary supervisor and provides on-site support at the start of the year into the first quarter. After the first quarter, interns continue at their school but also begin a series of three structured rotations. Rotations are aligned with the intern's interests and may include specialty training and experience in focused areas such as pre-school psychology, school mental health, behavior disorders and intervention, academic intervention, autism, low incidence disabilities, consultation and more. Over the course of the year, interns will have exposure to multiple school sites, a continuum of special education classrooms, community programs and collaboration and will work with an experience and diverse team of 13 psychologists.

The philosophy of our internship program is that this is a year for you to learn how to become competent practitioners. As such, our commitment to you is that we will give you the opportunities and tools to support your success. The support you receive as an intern is vital to reaching this goal. In addition to having the lead school psychologist as your primary supervisor, you have a doctoral level, secondary supervisor. You will receive two hours of face-to-face supervision per week. This is considered "protected" time and is a vital tool in your learning experience. Psychologists do not work alone in isolation, you will also have the opportunity to work alongside and learn from speech pathologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, and special education teachers and coaches.
