Our intern will have a primary supervisor, but then rotate to other school sites and certified school psychologists to obtain additional experience for internship requirements and gain exposure and practice with all grade levels (Preschool/Child Find through High School). Intern will first start with primary supervisor and then rotate to other sites, with the possibility to be on their own a few days a week, if time/schedule permits. Interns will be assigned cases and tasks by each site school psychologist that are common to daily practitioner duties, attend trainings and professional development, perform assessments, conduct observations, develop behavior intervention plans, possibly conduct trainings with supervision, write reports using current educational management system, provide behavior support, consult with special education and classroom teachers, facilitate meetings, and learn about state and district compliance.

We are in process of developing systems for best practice throughout Student Services Department. School culture and community is conservative, but the District is slowly implementing incremental changes. Because the District is smaller (10 school sites), staff is very consultative with one another. SP's are a part of the Student Services Department, which encompasses: guidance counselors, social workers, school psychs, English language learner staff, Section 504, and gifted. There are 5 total (1 open vacancy) school psychologists, 3 school social workers, and each school site has at least 1 school guidance counselor.
