
Background

- Intended to provide (1) full tuition support and (2) post-graduation induction support
- 2017-2018: first cohort of 15 master's students (MMD, Teach Arizona)
- Initially funded by the universities until Fall 2019
 - Partially funded by the state until 2021
 - Fully funded by the state from 2021 onwards
 - State funding is "last dollar", i.e., most non-loan aid goes to tuition, with ATA covering the remaining balance
 - In addition to tuition and mandatory fees, ATA now also pays for exam fees, certification fees, and institutional recommendations

Current Admissions Process

- Graduate
 - Teach Arizona: selected through application
 - All others: selected by programs
- Undergraduate
 - Generally selected through application (directors, advisors, recruiters included in ad hoc selection committees)
 - Spots reserved for Pathways and Bilingual students, recruited transfer students, students recommended by advisors



Current New Teacher Induction

- Universities are required to provide induction to ATA alumni during their first year of teaching; alumni participation is voluntary
- Each induction program is overseen by its "parent" professional program
 - Programs have historically received \$1,500 per graduate from the state (this amount is dependent on funding availability)
 - Programs provide coaching services, professional development opportunities and stipends, access to resources, etc.
 - Induction limited by ABOR/UArizona policies re: "state" money

Current Leveraging of ATA Funding

- Scholarship funding can provide free tuition for GYO programs, e.g.,
 Pathways and ITEP
- Induction funding can be used to supplement funding for external professional development opportunities, e.g., those available through TREC-affiliated partners — eligible ATA alumni must be included as PD participants
