

Sabino High School is hiring a University of Arizona student to serve as a College Readiness Associate (Mentor) to support high school seniors as they prepare for college and career pathways.

Responsibilities include:

- Guiding students through college, trade school, and job applications
- Assisting with financial aid and scholarship searches
- Meeting with students one-on-one and in small groups
- Supporting large workshops and events with the College & Career Readiness Coordinator
- You'll be based at Sabino's College & Career Lounge and expected to work independently while proactively engaging students.

- Hope Closet: interns will assist with our onsite resource closets which provide probation youth and their families with clothing, toiletries, and other essential resources.
- Department Initiatives and Programs: may include marketing, data generation/tracking, audits, research, reaching out to stakeholders and other project management-type duties.
- Journey.do: interns will assist with several aspects of this online platform designed for justice-involved youth to fill unmet criminogenic needs. Duties include youth story reviews with strength-based responses, creation of Growth Plans, data tracking and more.
- Detention: interns may be given opportunities to engage in supervised programming and tutoring supports for detained youth. Interns will also have opportunities to shadow detention officers.
- Probation: interns will be given opportunities to work with and/or shadow a variety of units throughout the probation department.

DETENTION TUTORING INTERNSHIP | OPPORTUNITIES

- Tutoring: interns' primary duty will be supervised one-on-one tutoring of youth in a classroom setting. GED prep. Elementary and high school level subjects.
- Exposure: to collaborating with detention professionals and what it means to work in a secure care setting.
- Rapport Building: interns will have daily supervised direct contact with detained youth.
- **Journey.do:** interns will assist with responding to stories in platform when time permits.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL INTERNS

- Tours and shadowing opportunities throughout the Judicial Branch
- Professional development and job insights within Juvenile Probation
- Hands-on immersive experiences
- Training: Safety and Security, Trauma Informed Care, Positive Youth Development, etc.
- Strengthen interpersonal and teamwork skills.
- Skill building such as critical thinking, problem solving, intercultural fluency... AND MORE!

ELIGIBLILTY

- Applicants MUST be actively attending a recognized AZ college or university. (Undergraduate or Graduate)
- Applicants MUST be at least 21 years old OR an official Junior or Senior
- Applicants MUST be able to work a minimum of 16 hours a week
- Applicants MUST be able to pass our basic criminal background check
